The English poet Ezra Pound (1895-1972) is recognized as one of the founders of modernism in literature. He was a precursor of what we now call avant-garde poetry. However, he also provoked discussion and controversy, due to his experimental style in his masterpiece, "The Cantos" (The Cantos).
The world of modernist poetry would never be the same without his contribution; the audacity of the American poet Ezra Pound (1895-1972). A student of Hamilton College, Pound is recognized as one of the founders of modernism in literature. He was a precursor of what we now call avant-garde poetry. Whether Pound was the deserving "king of cantos" is a matter of debate. "The Cantos" is a 120-section experimental poem published in 1905. The work is controversial and ambitious due to its experimental nature, its style, its composition, its fragmented and obscure sources, and its use of obscure historical and literary sources. With 800 pages, the stated objective of "cleaning up" the English language and making it more precise was not achieved. The work was written or its texts were made more accessible, but were discarded with more complex and opaque verses each time.
